Overview

Each year, more than 4.1 million people in the United States suffer a workplace injury or occupational illness. Injuries are always unexpected, but using simple and proven concepts, employees and contractors can learn to recognize at-risk conditions or behavior before they lead to a mistake or injury. The Industrial Safety Readiness Training (ISRT) program provides the core concepts of safety awareness for industrial workplace training, and an individual learning plan that addresses the most common hazardous situations faced in the industrial environment. The ISRT goal is to contribute to a reduction in workforce injuries and a higher degree of liability control.

The highly adaptable ISRT program helps individuals to:

- Build on your knowledge of OSHA regulations
- Reduce injuries and health problems among your co-workers
- Gain knowledge of changing regulations, guidance documents, and regulatory interpretations
- Demonstrate competency for working safely in an industrial setting
- Learn the fundamentals needed to deal with potential hazards

ISRT Program

The ISRT web-based training program is delivered through DuPont Sustainable Solutions Learning Management System with most courses available in both **English and Spanish**. These courses are continually updated with any safety standard modifications, such as modifying Occupational Safety and Health Administration's (OSHA) Hazard Communication Standard to bring it into alignment with the Globally Harmonized System of Classification and Labeling of Chemicals (GHS). You can work with your MSI Training Consultant to develop an individualized program from **over 1,600 courses available** or follow the complete ISRT course outlines for Manufacturing/Construction (production) Areas or Non-Manufacturing (non-production) Areas.

Once course registration has been completed, you will receive course log-in credentials *within 7 days of payment receipt* and may access the online courses or administrative reports immediately after that.

ISRT Certificate

Upon successful completion of the ISRT program, individuals can print a certificate of program completion valid for one year. Several manufacturers require all contractors to verify ISRT completion for entry to facility by showing the wallet size certificate or by accessing the ISRT database.

For Companies:

Q. What are the benefits for requiring the ISRT program for my employees?

A. With an emphasis on each trainee's role and responsibility in developing a more complete knowledge of, and appreciation for, workplace safety, the ISRT program provides employees with the ability to perform various tasks safely while at the same time ensuring maximum organizational productivity. The ISRT program may be used as a component of your facility's existing safety training program.

Q. What are the benefits for requiring the ISRT Certificate for my contractors?

A. The ISRT Certificate validates an individual's knowledge of core safety competencies required for industrial environments including production and non-production areas. Requiring all contractors to use the ISRT program creates a baseline of knowledge on which the company can add facility-specific safety requirements.

Q. Is the ISRT available in Spanish?

A. Yes, all of the required courses for the ISRT program are bilingual and available in both English and Spanish. Other languages may also be available upon inquiry. Please indicate language preference upon registration.

Q. Can I review the ISRT program before requiring it for my employees and/or contractors?

A. Yes, companies may request a test account to evaluate the ISRT program and determine how best to incorporate it within their training and safety program goals.

Q. Can I require additional courses for the ISRT program?

A. Yes, the ISRT program can be customized with more than 1,600 courses available from the DuPont Sustainable Solutions Management System. Environmental, human resources and other non-safety courses are also available. Q. What is the ISRT database?

A. The ISRT database is the record keeping system for the ISRT program. It contains individual records for all program participants including course completions and certificate status. In addition, the database includes a list of all contractors using the ISRT program.

For Individuals:

Q. How long will the ISRT program take?

A. Manufacturing/Construction ISRT online program takes between 8-10 (total) hours on average. Non-Manufacturing ISRT training takes between 3—5 (total) hours on average.

Q. Can I pre-test out of ISRT and still receive the ISRT Certificate?

A. Yes, each course has a pre-assessment that is required. If you pass the pre-test, it will take you to the next course pre-test. If you pass all pre-tests, then you do not have to take the online training and you will receive an ISRT certificate.

Q. When does the ISRT Certificate expire?

A. Your ISRT Certificate is valid for one (1) year from date of completion. The ISRT Certificate must be renewed annually to remain valid.

Q. What if I make a mistake, can I reset the ISRT course?

A. Yes, the course can be reset by emailing the MSI Technical Support Team at info@manufacturingskillsinstitute.org or calling 804-643-7489, ext. 21.

Q. How do I get my ISRT certificate of completion?

A. You or your supervisor is able to print the certificate of completion once you have mastered all the ISRT courses.

Q. What happens if I forget my ISRT Certificate and I am at the plant?

A. If the site is unable to verify your ISRT certificate through the ISRT database, either have your Supervisor fax over the certificate to the plant or you can contact MSI Technical Support Team at info@manufacturingskillsinstitute.org or calling 804-643-7489, ext. 21. to verify completion of the safety courses.

Q. What if my employer changes?

A. The ISRT certificate follows the individual who received the certificate and is documented in the ISRT database. If your employer changes, have your new employer notify the MSI of the employment change so that your company information is updated in the ISRT database.
